Tip: "Getting a little crazy with pattern is okay in our book, because it adds depth and interest" explains Pinon, "And in a small space, we like to paint the moulding the same color as the wall to visually raise the height of the ceiling."

Dekar Design brought some of our favorite trends to their apartment unit—marbled prints (on the master bedroom's headboard) and a mix of intricate geometric prints (in the living area). We love their eclectic combination of both sleek and rough-hewn Ballard pieces.

Tip: “We tried to layer on the patterns particularly in the living room. We have blue, black, white and red and we threw it off with a mustard coffee table that gives an authentic touch so it feels like it’s been collected through the years”
